

# Konbini Items 1

Learn the vocabulary for items sold at convenience stores in Japan

## Slides 1-4: Learning コンビニ Items

Vocabulary for popular items sold in convenience stores in Japan are introduced on slides 1-4. Each picture has audio attached which can be heard by tapping on it. (Note: Slide 3 has all items in Katakana, more information on how to use Slide 3 is listed on the next page.)

### Suggested Activity:

Teacher/student taps a picture to play the audio and students try to find the word in hiragana that matches the picture. The correct word can then be dragged to the picture to label it.

## Slide 3: コンビニ Items in Katakana

Some Katakana items are listed on this page. As the words are written in the same colour as the background, they appear to be 'hidden'. The words can be 'found' by moving the blue rectangle in the middle closer to the items.

### Suggested Activity:

Teacher/student taps on each picture to hear the audio. If students can write katakana they can write the words as they hear them and then check their answers by moving the blue rectangle to the appropriate position to reveal the word.

Can you write these Katakana words?  
Move the blue box close to the item to check the answer.

**Slides 5-9: Learning about Japanese Products**

Slides 5-9 introduce some of the more unique Japanese items sold at convenience stores that may be unfamiliar to students. The names of the items can be heard by tapping on the pictures. In-depth cultural information can be accessed by simply tapping on the question mark next to each item (tap the question mark again to make the information disappear).

**Suggested Activity:**

The teacher chooses one student to write the word in the light orange box, or alternatively, to drag the hiragana from the green box and make up the word.
