

# INTENSIVE SEMINAR APPLICATION GUIDELINES (PRE-SERVICE TEACHER)

This 3.5 day seminar held at The Japan Foundation, Sydney, run primarily for current teachers of Japanese, will be open for up to 4 pre-service teachers with an interest in teaching middle years Japanese.

#### DATES

Monday 16 January to Thursday 19 January 2017.

# <u>AIMS</u>

Participants will:

- learn from current teachers, and about available resources.
- create new networks.
- develop language skills and gain confidence in using Japanese by working in an immersion environment (please note: JPF Sydney will not guarantee that the level is suited to pre-service teachers as the main target is currently-practicing teachers).
- explore teaching ideas and strategies which they can then apply to their own classrooms in line with the Australian Curriculum, specifically Asian Literacy and Intercultural Understanding.
- receive a certificate of attendance at the end of the seminar.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicants must be currently studying towards, or have recently graduated with, teaching qualifications within the past two years and be actively seeking teaching work.
- Pre-Service Teachers of native or near-native speaker proficiency are *not* the target of this seminar.
- This seminar is aimed at teachers with language proficiency at least equivalent to JLPT N5. If you are unsure of your JLPT level, check the JLPT sample site here: <u>http://www.jlpt.jp/e/samples/forlearners.html</u>.

#### WHY PRE-SERVICE TEACHERS?

- Pre-service teachers are invited with the intention of providing a hands-on learning opportunity to the next generation of the Japanese teaching community. During the seminar, pre-service participants are required to actively learn from practicing teachers as well as share their own knowledge.
- Pre-service teachers are requested to respect the original target of the seminar (experienced teachers). We also expect pre-service teachers might find life-long friends and mentors!
